Rossby Visiting Fellowship

Join the research community at Stockholm University, Sweden, to work with leaders in Climate and Earth system sciences in the fields of atmospheric sciences, oceanography, the global water cycle, the cryosphere, global/regional climate and environmental variability and change, or paloeclimatology. Based at the department of Meteorology, the research environment now also encompasses the **Bolin Center for Climate Research** (http://www.bolin.su.se) involving several Earth and Environmental Science departments across the campus.

The International Meteorological Institute (IMI) was initiated by the renowned meteorology professor Carl-Gustaf Rossby in 1955 to "conduct research in meteorology and associated fields and to promote international scientific cooperation within meteorology". This is achieved through a thriving visitors program; since its inception IMI has hosted hundreds of short- and long-term scientific visitors and we are now looking for one or several 3-12 months visitors arriving during 2015.

As a Rossby Visiting Fellow you will get to know new colleagues and be able to start up collaborative efforts that go beyond your stay. You will also bring new experience and perspectives to the graduate student community and we encourage prospective Fellows to consider how they can contribute to supporting the graduate programs.

IMI will cover cost for accommodation while in Stockholm and will also cover travel costs to and from Stockholm. For visitors staying more than 6 months IMI will also support travel for accompanying family. A small *per diem* will contribute to cover extra costs of visitors who are, for example, on sabbatical leave.
